- **Recruitment for SWIS District Lt. Governor:** Maxine reported that the SWIS District Zone 5 is recruiting for someone to fill the SWIS District Lt. Governor position and encouraged anyone interested to apply. The position involves being a liaison between the zone's clubs and the district board.
- Steve and Deb Elvidge: Sadly, Deb Elvidge announced that she and Steve will be moving to Dubuque, will miss us, but will be resigning from our club. Deb is meeting with Amy Coffey to hand over Youth Committee information on oratorical and essay contests, Tri-Star Basketball, etc.
- Shirts for Sale: Maxine Lane noted she is taking orders for polo shirts with Club logo on them.
- Law Enforcement Appreciation Breakfast: Maxine asked for a show of hands on whether members would be willing to donate food for a breakfast she would like the Club's Community Service Committee to host in the spring to recognize local and county law enforcement personnel.

**HIGHLIGHTS OF THE BOARD MEETING, TUESDAY, AUGUST 29, 2023:** Vice President Reeves reviewed the following highlights from the Board meeting held on August 29, 2023

**TREASURER'S REPORT:** Duane Borgen, Treasurer, submitted the Treasurer's Report for period ending August 31, 2023 noting the balances of Internal and Youth Accounts, which were reported at the Business Meeting. In addition, the following was reported:

- **Bonding of Treasurer and Alternates**: Borgen noted he paid the additional amount (*in addition to \$119 paid previously*) to bond the Treasurer and alternates. Borgen had checked to see if the overall cost would be cheaper if we reduced the bond amount from \$50,000 to \$25,000, but the savings would have only been \$34 so it was not felt to be beneficial.
- Grants Paid in August included:
  - Platteville Sports Boosters \$100;
  - Friends of the Rollo and Jamison Museums \$350.
- **Motion from Board for approval:** Vice President Reeves reported the Board has made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Seconded by Paul Budden, motion carried.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

- Finance / Administration:
  - Lifetime Member Dues: Vice President Reeves reported that the Board has made a motion to increase the "Lifetime Membership" dues to \$75. It was further noted that the Lifetime Membership dues had not increased last year when the regular and spouse member dues were raised. Motion was seconded by Ken Kamps, and motion carried.
  - **Application for Donation Requests:** Vice President Reeves reported that the "Donation Request Forms" are now available via our website. This is a new platform for donation requests which will allow the Financial Committee to have everything streamlined, such as dollar amount, how many kids it will help, Platteville residents vs. Non-Platteville residents, etc. The deadline for donation requests is set for Sept. 15.

- **Committee Chair Recommendations for Budget:** Committee Chairs were reminded to submit their suggestions for their Committees' budgets to Duane by Sept. 19.
- Finance Committee Meeting: It was reported that the goal is to have the Finance Committee meet by the end of September to prepare a proposed budget for fiscal year 23/24.

## • Community Service:

- Dairy Day Parade Plans:
  - Bag/Pipe Band as noted above would like more volunteers;
  - Our Club banner will be carried by Amy Coffey's son Jamison and his friend in front of Ernie Thalmann's convertible, being driven by Charlie Clark. Our Charter members Ken Kamps and Tom Jonas will be riding in the convertible.

## • Membership:

- **Inquiries about Club:** It was reported that the Committee may be developing something to hand out during Dairy Days to people inquiring about joining the club.
- Valentine's Day NOW Event: Committee will be discussing the idea of having a Valentine's Day NOW event/dance instead of doing a NOW event in the Spring.
- **Publicity Newsletter(s) & Website:** Recognition was given to Chris Budden for posting pictures of speakers, check presentations, etc. on our website's blog.

## • Cheese Curd:

- **Report on Grant County Fair Results:** Gross revenue for the fair was reported with notation that sales were less than last year. The same amount of cheese was sold so the Committee is assessing contributing factors for the decrease in gross revenue.
- Plans for Dairy Days Sept. 8th to 10th: Tim Murphy and Steve Lane plan to set up the trailer on Thursday, Sept. 7<sup>th</sup>. Shift assignments are in place and supplies have been ordered.
- **Suggestions:** Committee Chair, Jordan Holthaus suggested that we increase the cost of soda and water and offer ranch dressing. These will be discussed by the committee for possible changes next year.

Jessica is the newly hired "English Language Learner" teacher for the Platteville School District. She serves students in the middle school and high school. Previously she was a high school English teacher, communications instructor at Southwest Technical College, and most recently worked for 8 years in the School of Education at UW Platteville. Today she shared with members, the importance of supporting our English language learner population in the Platteville community and talked briefly about means used to help these students.

Jessica noted that her conversion to this new position was a major life change for her, having taught high school English for many years. She started in her new position a few days before school started and "just loves what she is doing". She felt there is an amazing diversity in our district and noted how dynamics have changed, with an increase in school enrollment and classes that are offered.

Jessica noted that there are at least 13 different languages spoken in various homes in our district. She reported that in the school year of 2019-2020, there were approximately 20 students where English was not their first language. In 2021-2022, this rose to 28; in 2022-2023 this rose to 45; and since September 2023 it has risen to 78 students. She felt the increase is largely due to families wanting to move here because "it's a safe place to be".

Jessica ended her presentation by thanking the Club for all we do for our community.

Tim Ingram has been a member of the community since 2000 when he purchased the bike shop and renamed it Momentum Bikes.

Because his father was born in New Diggins and was raised in Benton, Tim has always had a close relationship with the area. He can remember at the age of 8 coming to Platteville to buy his first fishing pole with his birthday money at a store on Main St. in Platteville.

Tim has been passionate about bicycling since 1976, and enjoys sharing cycling with others. He mostly cycles through the mid-west, but has also cycled in Costa Rica and Mexico.

Tim noted he had always wanted to have a bike shop in a small community and continues to enjoy servicing his community, but now has been enjoying making art work with all the parts we would normally have thrown away.

Today Tim brought several of his creations including clocks and lamps made from recycled bike parts. Many incorporated marbles into their design and all were extremely unique. His art creations can be seen at "Timothy Ingram Arts", 35 W. Main in Platteville.

- Speaker for Next Week Sept. 29: Kent Scheuerell Grant County History
- Today's Speaker: Bakary Saidykhan Bicycles to Africa Program, recruited and introduced by Mark Essex.

Bakary Saidykhan is from Gambia, in West Africa. He came to Wisconsin in 2010 to visit a friend from Gambia. He met his wife Joely in 2011 and they were married in 2012. He has lived in America ever since and has completed the long and complex process to become a United States Citizen. Bakary currently works as a custodian at the Rountree Commons here in Platteville.

Bakary's presentation today was relative to his involvement with sending bicycles, bedding and other essential items back to his home country to help those in need.

With video, Bakary showed the geographic location of Gambia, which is the smallest country in West Africa and covers less than 4000 square miles. He showed pictures of the grass and mud huts that people live in in his home town of between 600 and 800 people.

Bakary talked about the schools in Gambia noting that tuition fees are paid for boys to attend, but not girls. They do pay for uniforms and supplies for girls, however. When visiting his home country, he noticed that children were walking long distances to school. This prompted him to start a program to collect bikes and transport them via shipping containers to his home community to assist children in getting to school. He currently has about 50 to 60 bikes stored up to provide to children between the ages of 12 to 15. He indicates that a shipping container to transport the bikes would cost \$7000 to \$8000. He does accept donations of bikes or school supplies such as spiral lined notebooks, pens and pencils that he will ship to them.

He truly enjoyed his many years of camping experiences at Wyalusing with students, where he helped them produce skits on local history, which on occasion were also shared at local nursing homes.

Always being interested in history, he noted that Elona Kindschi *(now deceased)* was a great influence in his life. He loved hearing about folktale stories she would tell.

With video, many props, and recruiting volunteer members to portray parts, Kent told many folklore stories related to the history of Grant County.
