Katie's Garden Halloween Event: It was reported that approximately 400 children went through the Halloween
event at Katie's Garden on evenings of October 27th and 28th. The Optimist provided books to many of those
children.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING REPORT: Vice President Hundhausen provided a summary of the Governing Board Meeting conducted at their October 30, 2023 meeting.

TREASURER'S REPORT: D. Borgen submitted the Treasurer's Report for period ending October 31, 2023 noting the balances of the Internal and Youth accounts. Vice President Hundhausen reported the Board has made a motion to accept the Treasurer's Report. Seconded by Maxine Lane, motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

• Finance / Administration:

- Approval of Check Signers for 23-24: Vice President Hundhausen reported the Board has made a motion to approve Duane Borgen, Amy Coffey, Howard Crofoot, Eileen Engelke, and Maxine Lane as authorized check signers. Seconded by Beth Frieders, motion carried.
- Approval of Volunteers to conduct a "Review of Accounts for Fiscal Year 22-23": Vice President Hundhausen reported the Board has made a motion to authorize Dan Engelke, Dianne Jentz, and Jerry Schewe to conduct the annual review of accounts. Seconded by Chris Budden, motion carried.
- **Update on Dues:** D. Borgen reported three names of members to the Board who have not yet paid their dues. Their names have been provided to the Membership Committee Chairs to contact for follow-up.
- **Proposed Budget for 2023-2024 Fiscal Year:** Copies of the proposed Internal and External budgets were distributed for review. Vice President Hundhausen led discussions related to the proposed budget.
 - Internal Account Budget: Vice President Hundhausen reported that a motion has been made by the Board to approve the proposed Internal Budget as printed. Seconded by Doug Martin, motion carried.
 - Youth Account Budget: Vice President Hundhausen reported that the Board has made a motion to accept the proposed Youth Budget. This was seconded by Tom Nall as a Member (also a Board member, however had not been not present at Board Meeting.)
 - **Discussion:** A lengthy discussion took place. Maxine Lane questioned the proposed Community Service Committee budget, noting it was less than what she as Chair of the Committee had requested. She provided information on events she wanted the Committee to facilitate. Vice President Hundhausen indicated he would donate funds to the Club to assist with some of the proposed events. --- Maxine also shared her concerns about budgeted support of the "Rainbow Alliance" organization, indicating she felt their mission wasn't in line with that of OI's, SWIS District's or our Club's. Becky Schambow also voiced opposition to the proposed grant to "Rainbow Alliance", noting she felt it set a precedence for any organization to request funding if "kids are present at their event". Others spoke in favor of supporting the grant request.
 - Vote: The members then voted. Few voices were heard "in favor" and Becky Schambow voted as being opposed. Some seemed to have abstained. Motion carried.

- Youth Account Investment Rates: Vice President Hundhausen reported that D. Borgen, Treasurer reported on CD and Money Market current investments and their interest percentage rates.

- **Today's Speakers:** Ed Barthel from Vestas American Wind Technology, accompanied by Brodie Dockendorf, from EDP Renewables North America were our speakers today. They were recruited by Tim Boldt.

Ed Barthel works for Vestas American Wind Technology as a Site Manager. He's been in the wind industry for 13 years after completing studies at Highland Community College from 2008-2010 in Wind Turbine Technology. Since 2018 he's been the Site Manager for the Quilt Block Windfarm in Darlington. He is responsible for overseeing the operations and maintenance activities that take place on a daily basis. Prior to 2018 he was a Lead Technician at the site and also spent 7 years traveling across the United States and Canada building and commissioning new windfarms. He's lived in the Midwest his entire life and enjoys educating people about the benefits of wind energy and its impact to surrounding communities.

Brodie Dockendorf assisted in the presentation representing EDP Renewables – North America. EDP Renewables is a company with experienced developers and operators of renewable energy, with wind farms, solar parks, energy storage projects, and green hydrogen solutions throughout the continent. The EDPR NA team is passionate about achieving a clean energy future and creating long-term value in the communities where we operate.

Their presentation included information about wind turbines, particularly those in the "Quilt Block Windfarm" located in/around Darlington that has 49 turbines. Speed of the turbines is set by wind speed, pitch angle and is done by computer. Troubleshooting and repair of turbines is accomplished 24/7 via monitoring out of Portland's facility.

In addition to renewable energy, they spoke of the impacts that wind turbines have on the community including substantial revenue paid to counties, townships and landowners.
