HIGHLIGHTS OF THE BOARD MEETING, TUESDAY, AUGUST 1, 2023: President Palfrey reviewed the following highlights from the Board meeting held on August 2, 2023

<u>TREASURER'S REPORT</u> for Period Ending July 31, 2023: Duane Borgen submitted the Treasurer's Report for period ending July 31, 2023 noting balances of Internal and Youth Accounts.

- Noted Grants Paid in July:
 - \$300 to Grant County Coordinated Services Team
 - \$250 to Platteville Public Library
- **Board Motion to Approve Financial Report:** President Palfrey reported a motion has been made by the Board to approve the July 31, 2023 Treasurer's Report. Seconded by Ken Kamps, motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

• Finance – Administration:

- **Bonding Insurance:** Due to some miscommunication, the bill received for bonding of our Treasurer and alternates came in higher than the \$119 expected. (The \$119 quoted was actually for bonding of the Board members). The Board did not feel the Board needed to be bonded, but Treasurer and alternates do.
 - Board Motion: President Palfrey reported a motion has been made by the Board "to authorize Duane to negotiate pricing for Treasurer and alternates and pay premium accordingly". Seconded by Tom Nall, motion carried.
- **Donation Requests:** Duane Borgen reported that he will be emailing donation request forms to agencies soon. President Palfrey will put the forms on our website so agencies can apply online.
- Increase in OI and SWIS Dues: Howard Crofoot had reported that OI will be raising membership dues by \$3, however this should not affect our current dues collected from our members. Crofoot also noted that SWIS District will be voting on possible increase in their dues by \$2.

Community Service:

- Party in the Park July 20th: Howard reported the event was successful. President Palfrey reported that Amy Coffey was chosen and recognized as our Club's Volunteer of the Year.
- Parade Entry and Bag/Pipe Band Update Dairy Day Parade September 9th:
 - Terri Ellis and Joy Schewe are working on decorating bags for the Bag/Pipe band. Mark Essex will be obtaining PVC and metal piping. Volunteers willing to be in the Bag/Pipe band are asked to attend a rehearsal at First English Lutheran Church on Monday nights at 5:00 p.m.
 - Maxine Lane is making arrangements to have our Charter Members Ken Kamps and Tom Jonas ride in a convertible in front of the Bag/Pipe band.
- **Donation of 1 Book to Neal Wilkins & 1 to Westview:** President Palfrey reported that Carley Borcherding has a large supply of Story Book Walk *(posters)* in storage at her home and would like to donate one to each of the Platteville elementary schools. Board approved this gift with the suggestion that Carley's picture be taken as our Club's leader of this program presenting them to a representative(s) from the schools.

• Suggestion for Park Clean-up: D. Borgen asked H. Crofoot (*Platteville's Public Works Director*) if the City still had the "Adopt a Park" program. Borgen suggested that Club may want to form a group to assist with Smith Park cleanup. Crofoot noted City crews are working on clean up, but will follow up on this.

Kathy Marty was introduced by Tom Nall who noted Kathy is the Coordinator for the GriefShare Program sponsored through the Community Evangelical Free Church in Platteville. She has been a facilitator for this program for nearly twenty years. Tom noted his appreciation for this program in helping him to deal with his grief over his loss of Fern (wife and missed Optimist Club member).

Kathy began her presentation by explaining that often grieving people receive a lot of support from individuals after their loved ones pass, but as time goes on, that wanes. She noted that grief periods are different for different people and that those experiencing grief should not be rushed.

The GriefShare program is an international organization formed to help those who have lost someone. The program is open for any participants who are age 18 years of age and older.

The local program has four facilitators and meetings are held every Wednesday from 6 to 8 p.m. for a 13 week period during the months of February to May and then September to December. The next session starts on Sept. 13th.

The sessions are self-contained and participants can join at any time. There is a \$20 fee which helps cover cost of participant guides provided.

Kathy shared written materials including a handout on "How to Help Grieving People", a brochure about the local program, and a handout on "Helping Grieving Children".

Lynn was recruited to speak by Eileen McCartney and introduced by Mary Ann Shurson.

Lynn began her love of diving in 1975 when she first went snorkeling. Lynn's love of the ocean was evident in video she presented showing pictures of various coral reefs and amazing pictures of beautiful and unusual sea creatures.

Lynn provided education on the importance of maintaining coral reefs, noting that they provide 2.6 trillion dollars per year in benefits. She noted that oceans are now warmer which has adversely affected the reefs. Over fishing, marine debris, dredging, cruise ships, plastics and micro plastics have also damaged reefs. A natural occurring algal bloom called "Red Tide" has become problematic and in 2014 a new disease named "Stoney Coral Tissue Loss" was discovered.

Lynn noted that this July was the hottest month in history and it greatly affected coral reefs. When temperature rises, coral bleaching occurs causing coral to get stressed and even die.

Lynn ended by noting that many attempts are being made to restore reefs, and that the public can help with donations, but also by respecting the shoreline.

Needing no introductions, Club members Tom Nall, Kevin Haertzen and Paul Budden shared information about their passion of coin collecting.

Tom began explaining his hobby began 25 years ago. His presentation focused primarily on different equipment that is helpful to the collectors. He provided handouts on various coins, and samples of things he uses including: white gloves to protect the coins; magnifying glasses of different powers; and reference books for grading coins; and yearly "Red Books" identifying US coins. Tom also had samples of coins in his collection in various individual cases.

Kevin's focus of coin collecting is that of "mint sets". He started this hobby in 1967 and has most years' mints since that time. Mint sets began to be offered in 1947 and with the exception of two years, have been made available each year. Providing a video presentation, Kevin provided a chart with information on different coins and their value. Video also showed how mint set packaging has changed over the years. Value of sets lies with the uncirculated mint sets being packaged in their original holder.

Paul's collection was entirely different than that of Tom and Kevin. Paul began his collection in 1979 and he attributes his interest to his military career and visits to various foreign countries. His collection contained foreign coins and bills from 153 different countries. His oldest coin of 1604 is from Scotland. Paul did note that collecting foreign money isn't as expensive as collecting US monies. Paul ended the presentation by advising members "they should never put money in the bank". He went on to explain that as a child he kept coins in a band-aid can and was concerned that his siblings might take his collection so he buried them in a road bank in their back yard. Later, the bank was graded by a road crew and the coins were gone which confirmed his recommendation that "you should never put your money in a bank".

Conclusion: The meeting concluded at 8:05 a.m.
