- Speaker for Next Week, October 27th: Jeff Gard, UW Pioneer Basketball Program
- Today's Speaker: Dr. Tammy Evetovich, was recruited and introduced by Maxine Lane.

Dr. Tammy Evetovich was appointed the 15<sup>th</sup> Chancellor at UW-Platteville this past spring. Previously she served as the Interim Chancellor for about one year and the role of Provost for two years at UW-Platteville. Chancellor Evetovich's priorities include student success and providing experiential learning opportunities that prepare students to be active and engaged members of our communities. She believes students can be successful in many ways, but if we are supporting their growth mentally, physically, intellectually, and socially, graduation rates, career preparation, and personal goal attainment will naturally follow.

Dr. Evetovich first noted she was thrilled and honored to be with us today. She provided some personal history, noting she grew up on a farm in Nebraska, the youngest of five kids, which instilled in her an appreciation of the mid-west and rural areas. Her husband, Mark, is the Principal at Shullsburg Schools and together they have two children, a daughter who is a physical therapist, and a son who is working on his MBA.

She is a firm believer in looking at data to make decisions and noted that under her leadership, there are five key areas of focus at the University including:

- Enrollment, which has declined. They are looking closely at data and she was pleased to report that it has gone up this year and is at 6702.
- Budget;
- Strategic Planning;
- Philanthropy;
- Wellness, both social and occupational wellness.

Dr. Evetovich was pleased to report the addition of UW-Platteville's PA program, being provided in partnership with UW-Madison. She also reported that collaboratively with UW Oshkosh, they have a nursing program where students can do their first three years towards BS degree at Platteville, and then do their 4<sup>th</sup> year on-line with Oshkosh.

When asked what changes she's made since she was named Chancellor, she reported that she expanded her cabinet, brought in a data expert, and has brought more people to the table to start solving problems.

In conclusion, she stated that she believes UW Platteville needs to partner with the community and she recognizes importance of being out in the community.

  - Invitation to Attend Focus Group Meetings for Pedestrian/Bicyclists at Platteville Library: President Reeves reported receipt of an email from Mary Malischke advising the Optimist Club that the City has received a grant to use towards bike and pedestrian safety. The email invited Club members to attend a focus group meeting where Alyssa Schaeffer, Assistant Planner, Southwest WI Regional Planning Commission wants to gain citizen's thoughts on strengths of bike and pedestrian system and places for improvement. - **Today's Speaker:** Jeff Gard, UW Platteville Pioneer Basketball Coach, recruited and introduced by Club member Tim Boldt, who is also the President of UW Platteville's Booster Club.

Coach Gard has been the Head Basketball Coach for 15 years at UW-Platteville. Coach Gard began his presentation by stating he felt that our Club's beliefs/creed tie in with the UW's basketball program.

Noting that the program started with 30 players at the beginning of the year, the roster is now set at 21. He comically said that the "new hill" probably had something to do with the loss of some of the players. *(The hill team members used in prior years' workouts now has solar panels on it.)* Players work with a strength coach four days each week and practices have been extremely competitive. He noted that only two of the team members will be graduating this year.

Coach Gard was proud to say the team has collectively performed 230 hours of community service, noting they have volunteered at food pantries, Dairy Days, and "Reading with Pioneers" program with Platteville and other local students. He's hopeful that after they graduate, they will take a desire back to their home towns to be involved with their communities. Coach was appreciative of the Community's support at games, noting that thus far there have been 430 season tickets sold, which is an increase over those sold last year. Coach noted that letters will soon go out to fans who may want to provide meals to the team over break.

Upcoming events he highlighted included:

- Guarding Against Cancer events will take place at WIAC schools as fund raisers for CA research;
- Platteville Pioneers will have a non-conference game with the UW Madison Badgers in 2025 for a "Guarding Against CA" event.
- Monday, November 6<sup>th</sup> there will be a trick-or-treat event from 6:00 to 7:30 p.m. at the Field House.
