Jimmy and Bridget talked about the Foundation's purpose including provision of scholarships and enrichment of campus life for students. They stated that seven out of ten students struggle financially and they work to make sure students' basic needs are met.

• Today's Speaker: Jeffrey Strange – UW Platteville Theatre Representative – All Things Theatrical Planned for Summer and Upcoming Year" introduced by Maggie Kleisath

Jeffrey Strange is a Professor of Theatre and Resident Designer for UW Platteville where his scenic and/or lighting designs have included Betrayal, Macbeth, The Crucible, Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead, Ghosts, God of Carnage, Assassins, Death and the Maiden, The Normal Heart, The Pillowman, Noises Off!, Godspell and 1776. He has also designed Nunsense, Fiddler on the Roof and Shrek the Musical for the Heartland Festival. He has also designed Peter and The Starcatcher, Bright Star, and Once with the Platteville Summer Arts Festival. His designs have also been seen at Tennessee State University (The Birthday Party and Ruined -American College Theatre Festival Region IV Finalist), Weathervane Theatre (Hair, Ragtime, Legally Blonde, Music Man), Stagedoor Manor (The Wild Party, Chicago, Sweeney Todd, Sweet Charity, Les Miserables, The Producers), Hilberry Rep (The Taming of the Shrew, Hamlet, The Seagull, Pippin) and the Moscow International Theatre Festival (Lie of the Mind).

Jeffrey has been part of the UW-Platteville Theatre for the past 11 years, mentoring students in Scenic and Lighting Design and Technical Direction. Together with his wife Sarah Strange (Costume Design) and colleagues Dr. Ann Farrelly (Direction and Acting), Connie Salutos- Furlan (Choreography), and Josh Lawyer (Design and Concert Hall Technical Direction), they have enriched the arts in Southwest Wisconsin with challenging performances and continuously provided opportunities to the UWP students.

UW-Platteville presents two plays and one musical each year. Mr. Strange noted his pleasure in empowering students to do things they are passionate about in theatre arts. He stated that he believes Platteville has an advanced audience, and it's important for the students to experience their art form and share it with our community.
