- Next Week's Speaker July 19, 2024: Vice President Hundhausen advised members that our very own member, Beth Frieders, will be our speaker next week and will be talking about what it takes to care for her horses.
- Today's Speaker Dr. Kyle Quillan: Dr. Quillin was recruited to speak today by Becky Schambow and was introduced by Charlie Clark.
 - Dr. Quillin obtained his medical degree as "Doctor of Osteopathic Medicine", from Rocky Vista University College of Osteopathic Medicine in Parker Colorado. He did his residency in Otolaryngology and Facial Plastic Surgery at St. Elizabeth Boardman Hospital Mercy Health Youngstown, in Boardman, Ohio. He is board certified in Otolaryngology and Facial Plastic Surgery.
 - Dr. Quillin provides services at Southwest Health specializing in treatment of ear, nose and throat conditions, allergies, and sinuses for patients of all ages. Dr. Quillin also helps patients with other conditions, such as head and neck skin cancer, removal and treatment of the thyroid and parathyroid.

Raised in the La Crosse area, he has made it his life's work to improve the quality of life in his patients. Dr. Quillin resides in Dubuque with his wife Kari and their three lovely little girls.

In beginning his presentation to the members, Dr. Quillin stated he didn't know much about the Optimist Club before coming to today's meeting. He thanked the members of our Club for what we do as community leaders and encouraged us to keep up the good work.

He stated he's been in practice for three years now and indicated he wasn't giving members a sales pitch, but did share two handouts highlighting what services he and his department at Southwest Health can provide to the community. Between his Physician Assistant and himself, one of them is in the office every weekday. Dr. Quillin works out of both Southwest's Platteville and Kieler offices. His practice involves taking care of everything from the neck up, outside of your eyes and brain. Outside of medications, he advised members of things people can do at home for the following:

- Ringing in Ears: Explaining that these are sounds you perceive that are not there. Water intake will help. He encourages people to record what you drink and try to keep increasing water intake. He noted that drinking coffee, tea and alcohol all counters out water intake.
- Phlegm in Throat: This is often caused by not having enough water, making secretions thicker.
- Dizziness / Imbalance: To help alleviate these concerns, he encouraged people to keep their blood pressure at a good level.

He stated that he would be shocked if people didn't see improvement in the three symptoms above after making efforts to drink more water, He challenged members to give it a try.

He ended in saying that he truly enjoys what he does, noting it is rewarding to see the improvements he sees in patients.

- Next Week's Speaker July 26, 2024 Dan Rohrbach, CEO of Southwest Health Center providing updates on Southwest Health Center services and plans.
- Today's Speaker: Beth Frieders, Club member, was recruited by Becky Schambow to speak today about her horse hobby.

Providing an introduction for Beth, Becky Schambow noted that in the past few years as she's gotten to know Beth, she's been intrigued learning about Beth's horse hobby and what it entails to take care of horses.

Beth started riding horses at the age of 4, and during college and graduate school she was involved in showing her sister's Arabian horses. She got her first horse at the age of 20, whom she had for 34.5 years. Beth currently owns two horses and uses both of them for a sport called endurance riding, and Beth noted she plans to do a 150 mile ride this upcoming weekend with her horses.

With video slides, Beth provided a very interesting presentation related to keeping her horses, Fanny and Bunny healthy. This includes annual, and even semi-annual vaccines to prevent: Rabies; Tetanus: West Nile Virus; Eastern and Western Equine Encephalitis; Potomac Fever; Equine Influenza; and de-worming medication.

With pictures depicting the structure of horses' teeth, Beth explained that horses' teeth continually grow until they are twenty years old. Horses chew in a rotary fashion and if they don't chew fully, they don't get enough nutrition from their food. With the help of an Equine dentist, or Beth's veterinarian, Beth ensures that her horses' teeth are ground one to two times per year to level out their chewing capacity to maintain appropriate chewing and nutritional benefits.

Video pictures were also shown to identify the horses' leg and hoof structure. Beth noted "the hooves make the horse" and if they aren't level, problems including lameness can arise. Horses actually walk on their "fingernail and their frog" and it is very important that their hooves have proper angles and length. She has a Farrier come every four to six weeks to do nail trimming and shoe fitting on Fanny

and Bunny as needed. A video depicting the process was shown and Beth noted that the horses' hoof wall and callus don't have much feeling in them, so the horses aren't hurt by this process.

Beth brought a rasp and a hoof boot to show as examples of items used in hoof trimming.

It was noted that the hotdogs and cookies Club gave out went quickly. Mark Essex received the "Optimist Club Volunteer of the Year" award for his dedicated service to our Club.
 - Donations to Fire Department: On behalf of the Fire Department's fundraising committee,
 Paul Budden expressed appreciation to the Club for placing a donation jar which yielded \$55 in
 collections from donors at Party in the Park who contributed to the fund for the new fire
 department.
- Next Week's Meeting August 3rd: Club's Business Meeting will be next week.
- Today's Speaker: Dan Rohrbach, CEO of Southwest Health was recruited and briefly introduced by Becky Schambow. Although Dan didn't feel he needed an introduction as he felt most members knew

him, it is noted that Dan has over 25 years of experience in leadership roles in rural healthcare organizations. Dan came to Platteville and took over as CEO of Southwest Health in September 2011.

Dan provided information about the growth of the organization since 2011.

In 2011 Southwest Health had 245 employees. Today Southwest Health has 620 employees. Dan noted that Southwest Health recruits good people, trying to ensure that they hire the right people for their organization.

Southwest Health strives to be a regional presence for our community and the growth in the services they provide has been remarkable. Highlights Dan noted included:

- Southwest Health has 82 providers that include MD's, DO's and mid-level medical staff practitioners.
- In addition to the Main Campus in Platteville, Southwest has opened new clinics in Cuba City, Kieler, and Darlington.
- Family Practice is the Foundation of the services provided, with twenty-two providers, including nine physicians and thirteen Advanced Practice Practitioners.
- Dr. Alberto Vitela, a General Surgeon, will join Southwest Health in August 2024, which together with Dr. Scott Houghton enhances SH's General Surgery services.
- Dr. Maggie Moses, a Dermatologist, will join the staff full time in the summer of 2025. Dan noted that often times getting an appointment to see a Dermatologist has a wait time of over a year, so having a full-time Dermatologist on staff will be a tremendous addition to services at Southwest Health.
- Dan stated the Orthopedic Institute at Southwest Health is a "support department" that helps generate services provided in other areas. There are four Orthopedic Surgeons including: Dr. Josh Lindsey; Dr. Dayton Opel; Dr. James Prosser; and Dr. Alex Stassman. Recent additions to the Orthopedic Department include two Podiatrists, Dr. Spencer Hammack and Dr. Moiz Hassan.
- The Eye Center's six Optometrists and an Ophthalmologist, provide services at the Main campus, and outlying clinics at McGregor Plaza in Platteville, Lancaster and Darlington.
- In addition to a variety of specialty services provided by Southwest Health providers, UW Health now leases an area at Southwest Health providing additional specialty services.

Dan talked about the planned addition of a "Medical Office Building" on Southwest Health's main campus. The driving need for the additional building is the need to add additional surgery/operating rooms in the hospital, where surgical rooms will go from the four Southwest currently has to seven. To accomplish this, the Eye Center, ENT, Dermatology, and Mental Health services will move to the new building. In addition, there will be conference rooms in the new building. This building is currently in the design phase, with goal of breaking ground in the spring of 2025. After designated departments move to the new building, work will begin to expand surgery, and internally the Lab, Infusion Center, Inpatient Pharmacy and the UW Health area will move to the vacated areas. Anticipated completion date is the summer of 2027.

With concerns expressed about current parking availability, Dan stated the Main campus will be adding fifty parking stalls within the next several weeks.
